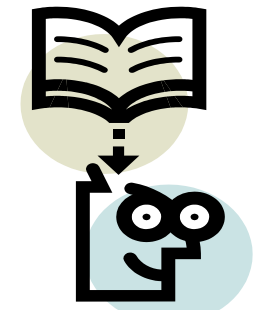

TAWL is proud to shine a spotlight on books that have won the Jane Addams Peace Award (JAPA) by promoting peace, social justice, world community, and the equality of the sexes and races.

Jane Addams was an outspoken woman with strong opinions. In 1915, when she spoke out against WWI, declaring all war to be a horrific waste of lives and money, she was called a socialist, a communist, even a traitor. Fifteen years later she was the first American woman to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

With her long-time companion Ellen Starr, she founded Hull House in Chicago to provide services for indigent and immigrant women and children. She was influential in struggles for women’s suffrage, improved working conditions, and establishing special courts for juveniles. She helped found the NAACP, the ACLU, and the Women’s International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF). Social justice was her passion. www.wilpf.org
